INGLEWOOD TOWN HALL COMMITTEE SUPPORTS THE NEW TOWN HALL HUB PROJECT

It is with great excitement that the Inglewood community moves closer to the opening of the Town Hall Hub. Planning began back in 2010 when an \$30,000 funding application for a Feasibility Study was won. Lesley Humphries facilitated the Inglewood Focus on Feasibility Report and Strategic Plan that was presented to Shire in March 2011 and the rest, as they say, is history.

In a few short weeks the facility will be open and the ICNH - Inglewood Community Neighbourhood House will move in.

On August 11th *Colleen Condliffe*, Vice President of ICNH and *Kim Hanlon*, Centre Manager were delighted to accept a cheque for \$2,500 from *Town Hall CoM* representatives, *Don Walker* and *Alan Saunders*. This donation will go towards the purchase of Board Room tables for the new Hub. The Town Hall CoM has also

contributed to the project through the restoration of the original Mayoral Chair and Board Room table that will remain on show and a valued community asset that will always remind us of our past, present and future.

Handing the keys back to the community

Council is looking forward to handing the keys to Inglewood's refurbished town hall and adjacent community centre to the people who will treasure it.

Power has been connected to the building and finishing touches are all that remain on the two level community centre.

Our operations team anticipates contractors will have vacated the site by the end of the month and passed the keys to Council for safekeeping.

We'll make a detailed inspection of the facility and tie up any loose ends before officially handing the keys over to the community.

This project is a wonderful example of all that can be achieved when an engaged community works hand in hand with business and government.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Town Hall Reference Group, and in particular residents who donated their time to guide this project from the outset.

The project also wouldn't have come to fruition without the joint financial backing of local, state and Australian governments, along with a generous contribution from the Inglewood and District Community Bank.

At this stage it's anticipated the town hall and community centre will have its doors swung open to the public **by early October**.

Landscaping works including paving and turf around the centrally located buildings have been proposed.

The matter is expected to be discussed at the Council meeting scheduled to be held at the Wedderburn Council Offices today (Tuesday 23 August).

ENROL TO VOTE IN THE 2016 LODDON SHIRE COUNCIL ELECTIONS

It's time for all eligible residents and ratepayers to enrol for the upcoming Loddon Shire Council elections.

Electoral Commissioner Warwick Gately has issued a call ahead of the enrolment deadline: 'You must be enrolled by 4.00 pm Friday 26 August to have your say—if you're 18 or over and you live or pay rates in Loddon Shire Council, check your enrolment now.'

Australian citizens living within Loddon Shire who have recently turned 18 or changed their address can enrol or update their details at <u>vec.vic.gov.au</u>. Paper enrolment forms are also available at any Australia Post or Australian Electoral Commission office.

Anyone on the State electoral roll for their current address and non-resident property owners are automatically enrolled for the elections.

There are also additional enrolment categories for occupiers, company nominees and non-Australian citizens who pay rates for an address in Loddon Shire. People in these categories can apply directly to council to enrol, by calling (03) 5494 1200.



Preparation are well under way of the 10th Annual Kooyoora Wildflower Show, to be held at the Inglewood Eucy Museum over the weekend of the **17th and 18th of September**.

This years event will mark the 10th Anniversary of the Kooyoora Wildflower Show conducted by the Friends of Kooyoora (State Park)

The Friends of Kooyoora also conduct a number of guided bus tours into the Kooyoora State Park during the weekend, which in addition to the wildflower tour leaders, also included bird, butterfly and indigenous specialists on some tours.

A main feature of the Show is the Photographic Competitions and Displays; which has become one of central Victoria's largest and most prestigious of its type. Entries are now available for this competition with entries closing on Monday 14th Sept.

The Competition attracts over 100 entries in the categories of local Landscapes, Flora and Fauna. Each category is held in the age groups sections of Open, under 18 and under 12.

The competition is unique with the all the entries being displayed over the weekend of the Wildflower Show and the place getters in each category and each section being determined by popular choice from votes cast by the attending public.

The method of judging provides a total interactive experience between the show attendees and the photographic display / competition. This feature has proven to be both popular with the public and exhibitors also gain a greater satisfaction having their work recognized by a popular vote rather than if judged by a single individual.

The votes cast over the weekend are counted on the Sunday with placegetters being announced and prizes presented at the end of the Show. First, second and third placegetters are awarded in each category and section. In addition to the 27 placegetters prizes awarded for the competition, a number of encouragement awards are also made. Award winners who will not only achieve the prestige of being recognized by the judging public attending the Show but will share in a cash and prizes worth in excess of \$1000.

This Competition provides the opportunity for new and up coming photographers to compete, display, sell their works and become more recognized. In order to stimulate the opportunity for a regular turnover of successful exhibitors the first place winners of each of the previous year's Open Sections are restricted from re-entering the same category they won in the following year.

The competition display is complemented with the previous years Open winners being invited to display some of their current and previous award winning works, adding to the range of additional high quality works that will be on exhibition. 2015 Open section winners were: Landscape – Brian Boyton (Wedderburn): Fauna – Anthony Blackley (Rheola); Flora – Ric Raftis (Wedderburn).

We are Becoming Power Readers!


